12" Double Row



Ideal way to put many peppers into extremely limited space and still have easy picking access..

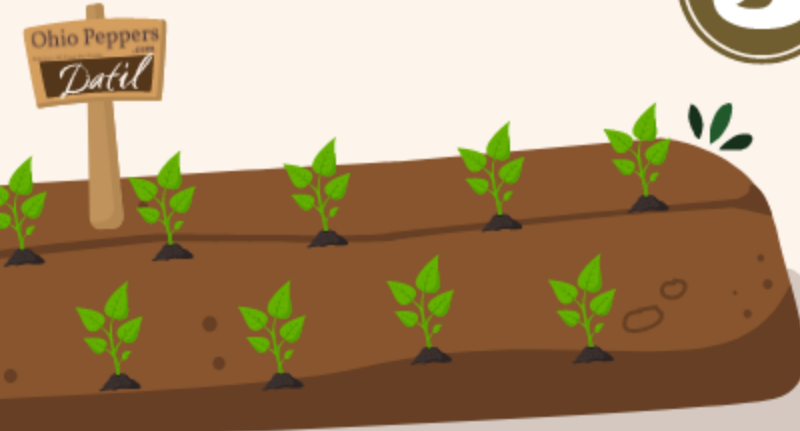
16" Spacing Woes

This patch of garden space looks great when seedlings are small. Plenty of room to navigate. Be aware that as plants grow, any pepper not on an edge may become inaccessible as some plants can grow upwards of 5' tall and 3' wide

16" Double Row



Measured stem to stem. Plants are staggered. Great way to fit many plants into available space with less resource competition and reduced production that's possible with 12".

18-24" Spacing

Ideal for chinense peppers, which include all superhots and popular peppers like habaneros, Carolina Reaper, and ghost peppers. Extra spacing makes harvesting easier.

Pots/Containers

Fabric pots and even plastic buckets work great and have become very popular with pepper growers. A 5 gallon fabric pot (actually 3 gallons) has a diameter of 12" and will grow a full sized, productive plant.
